We need to take a deep breath, and do our best to fight the store lines, and do our best to make this year another "Merry Christmas!"



Over the last few months, we have seen tangible movements in the political landscape across North America. Take the time you need in this Advent season to prepare your homes and hearts to receive the hope of our world. As members of Christ's body, when we live out this hope, Christ becomes more present in our world.

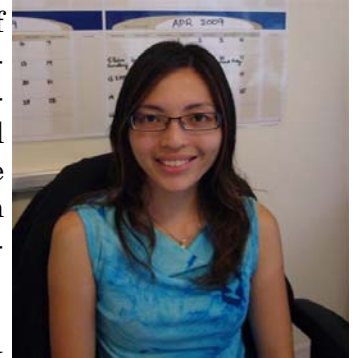
Check out the website to obtain a description on each of the eight courses. These courses are offered at various times of the year, at various locations throughout Canada.

Making Your Advent Wreath

Make a round form from styro-foam, wood or wire. Cover with fresh evergreen. Insert four candles - three purple and one pink. On Christmas Day, place a white candle in the centre of the wreath and light all the candles.



First Sunday of Advent

(November 30)

(light the first purple candle)

Lord, we see in this circle a symbol of your everlasting love. Help us to spread your love to all those we meet. Amen.

Second Sunday of Advent (December 7)

(light the first and second purple candle)

Lord, the green of these branches reminds us that you continually give and renew life. Help us to bring new life through the kindness we show to others this week. Amen.

Third Sunday of Advent (December 14)

(Light the 2 purple candles, and the pink candle)

Lord, as we light these purple and pink candles we realize that we are waiting joyfully for the renewal of your coming among us. Let us spread this joy with all we meet. Amen.

Fourth Sunday of Advent (December 21)

(Light all four candles - Purple and pink)

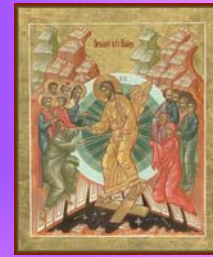
Lord, the light of these candles reminds us that you are the light of the world. May that light open our hearts, so that we may bring light to those who live in darkness. Amen.

Christmas Day:

(Light all five candles)

Lord, today we celebrate the birth of Jesus. Help us to bring His love, life and joy to all those we meet. Amen.
