been part of the Redemptorist Mission since the miraculous icon was given to the Redemptorists by Pope Pius IX in 1866.

The original icon, which is now found at the Church of St. Alphonsus in Rome, is believed to have be written by St. Luke,

the Evangelist. Over the past number centuries, this image of Mary Perpetual Help has been. and continues to well known image of our Lady, and since the icon has been St. Alphonsus Church, Rome entrusted the Redemp-

Blessed Gennaro Sarnelli C.Ss.R. Redemptorist Prophet of Justice

Blessed Gennaro Sarnelli C.Ss.R. was a contemporary of St. Alphonsus. He lived his religious life in service to the poor and marginalized in the big cities. As a prophet of justice, he wrote the following as



part of a conference that he gave:

"How many wealthy live today in Christendom! They spend their time at banquets, at feastings and diversions while the poor of Jesus Christ die of hunger. How many servants and hired hands are defrauded of their just recompense. How the poor struggle to collect what they have earned and would to God that they got it intact! How many rich there are that have a superabundance of everything - except

of God! The rich do not wish to vie the Lord in the person of the poor even a fraction of the goods of this world - not even to gain eternal life. The strictest judgment is reserved for those who have acted without mercy toward their neighbour!"
