On January 25, 2007, Redemptorists and, the Church around the world rejoiced and celebrated the Episcopal Ordination and Installation of The Most Reverend Gerard Pettipas, C.Ss.R. as the Archbishop of Grouard-McLennan in northern Alberta.

Archbishop Gerry as born on September 6, 1950, as the 3rd of 4 children. At the age of 16, Gerry entered the minor seminary with the Redemptorists in Brockville, ON to test his call of a vocation to Redemptorist life and priesthood. Over the years, Gerry studied hard for his B.A., M.Div, and an

eventually a MA in Spirituality and Counseling. Gerry was ordained on May 7, 1977 in Toronto.



In the years following his priestly ordination, Gerry has worked in Parish Ministry in St. John's, Toronto and Grande Prairie. Gerry has also served as Voca-

tion Director, Novice Master, and been a part of the Redemptorist Youth Mission Team in St. John's and Saint John.

In Gerry's most recent ministry, he had been pastor of St. Joseph's Church in Grande Prairie, AB for seven years. During this time he has shepherd the people in building a new Church, which is soon to be opened.

The Episcopal Ordination on January 25th was held at the Crystal Gardens in Grande Prairie, since the new Church was not ready, and the current Church is un-



able to hold the 1400 people who were in attendance. 30 Redemptorists, and Priests serving in the Archdiocese, 15 Bishops, family, friends and over 1300 parishioners from St. Joseph's Church and parishes throughout the Archdiocese came to celebrate with their new Archbishop.

Gerry continues the tradition of Redemptorist leadership within the Church in the ministry of Bishop. Over the centuries, there have been



many Redemptorist Bishops including our Founder, St. Alphonsus Liguori, St. John Neumann, Bl. Vasyl Velychkovsky, Canadian Bishop Gerald Murray, and countless Bishops who still serve the Church in leadership today.

The gifts for ministry that Gerry has been given will truly be a gift to the Church, not only in northern Alberta, but the Church in Canada and around the world. Gerry is a man of compassion, prayer, faith, and love for those for whom he is called to minister. He has been, and continues to be a model of the Redemptorist Charism, brought to life through the work of the Holy Spirit and in his priesthood.



Archbishop Gerry, we continue to pray for you, and pray with you as you begin your new ministry in the Church. We also ask you to pray for us Redemptorists and for all the young

men who are discerning their call to our way of life. We also look forward to continuing to serve with you in Grande Prairie and throughout the Church in Canada.

The only way to end here is to quote Gerry himself, who wrote at the end of his Ordination program by saying, "Thanks, God. You're the greatest!"

Article 3: Formation in General

Have you ever gone in the wrong direction, only to find that it seems like there's no way out? On our Lenten journey, we are allowed to make U-Turns; in fact we're encouraged to do so! We have the chance to turn back to God when we have done something wrong, or hurt

someone, and seek forgiveness and reconciliation from God and others. Lent offers us the chance to start over.

At different times in our life we notice that we are in need of repair. We may need to change the way we view life, or how we act towards people we may not get along with. We may need to change certain things about us that may not be good for us. We are in
